Tooele County Jr. Livestock Show



The Tooele County Jr. Livestock Show is July 31-Aug 3 at Deseret Peak. All animals must be tagged by June 1 (the Beef deadline has passed). 3 tagging events will be held: May 29 from 6-8 pm at Deseret Peak, May 31, 5-6 pm and June 1, 9 am-noon both at the Tooele High Animal Lab on 200 West in Tooele.

Show registration and fees are due by July 1st. Register online through fairentry.com. Click on 'find your fair'. Scroll down to 'Utah' and then '2024 Tooele County Livestock Show & Sale'. Look for the logo pictured here. Registration is open April 24-July 1. Pay a grounds fee for each youth plus a fee per animal. Youth may show one animal in up to 4 different species or two animals in one species. You must register all animals including alternates. No fee for alternates. Youth must also register for showmanship, it's required to sell your animal. You should get 2 emails from fairentry: 1st that you have an account & a 2nd after you register & pay. If you don't get both emails, you are NOT REGISTERED for the livestock show and will not be able to participate.

If you wish to enter the optional Record Book Contest at the livestock show, turn in your 4-H portfolio (record book) to the 4-H office by 6 pm on July 23. This contest has three 4-H divisions and each division has 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. <u>Don't forget</u>, everyone submits an <u>updated 4-H portfolio on October 1 to be eligible for next year's stock show, even if you submit it for this record book competition</u>. Livestock Show pen set up is July 29th at 8 am at Deseret Peak. Help is appreciated. The weigh-in for all market animals is Wednesday, July 31 from 4-6 pm. A checklist and show information is available on tooele4h.org.

Save these Tuesdays: Summer Livestock-Turkey Clinics at the THS Animal Lab



Tooele High FFA has invited 4-H youth to participate in their animal clinics this summer at the Animal Lab building on the corner of Vine and 200 West in Tooele. Clinics usually begin at 10 am unless the presenter needs to change it. The dates are <u>June 18 & 25</u> and <u>July 16 and 23</u>. The topic of each clinic will be announced soon. Plan on one clinic for each species shown at the livestock show.

There is a Turkey Clinic on July 9 for those who have ordered turkey poults and everyone interested in future turkey projects. Plan on 10 am at the Animal Lab unless we let you know different via an email.

4-H Horse



4-H horse season is off and running! Registration for all 3 summer shows is open on 4h.zsuite.org. the 1st show registration includes your horse information. Make sure you fill it out!

Be sure to get on the 2024 Tooele 4-H Horse GroupMe text app. Talk to your club leader to be added to it. Announcements come through the app, including horse show gate calls and information.

The horse council has several service days for youth and their families to improve the arena. 4-H youth participants earn points toward state qualifier standings. Be sure you check in and stay for the entire time to receive the points. Check with your leader or the Group Me for more details.

Tests are online. They are sent to your email after you are registered for the show. The test is timed, once you begin you have to complete it. Pay close attention to the time. It must be <u>submitted</u> before it expires or it won't count and you could miss out on the rest of the show. 'Test' is required to participate in the rest of the show.

The 1st Tooele County 4-H horse show is May 31-June 1 (registration is open & closes May 15). Food Almighty BBQ will be there! The 2nd Tooele County 4-H show is June 21-22 (registration is open & closes June 5) and the 3rd show is July 19-20 (registration is open & closes July 1). Look for Burnout BBQ and Smokin Beehive BBQ at the 2nd and 3rd shows. All shows are at the Grantsville Arena. The state 4-H Horse Show is at the Wasatch County Arena in Heber City, September 25-28. (Working Ranch & English is the 25th. Two handed and foal is the 26th and the 2-day Western Individual show is the 27-28th.)

4-H Mustang Camp



4-H Mustang Camp is a chance to understand the different sides of wild mustangs. Experience field time on the west desert observing the Onaqui band of mustangs This is an amazing overnight opportunity for youth who are finishing the 6th grade and older. Camp is June 6-7. It begins at 11 am at the 4-H office in Tooele. Register through 4h.zsuite.org. Cost \$60. More info on utah4h.org.




4-H Art: Acrylic Painting and Mosaic Art Camp
