FARMERS MARKET FAQ

What is the 4-H Farmers Market?

The 4-H Farmers Market is an opportunity for youth to market their gardening projects. The Farmers Market last year was fun! 4-H members were able to sell their produce, talk to customers about their vegetables, earn a return for their gardening efforts, and practice being a real entrepreneur!



How does it work?

Tables are set up outside the crop barn. Each youth is assigned their own section of table. They may decorate their space however they wish. Participants are in charge of selling their own items and collecting their own money. Prices are set by each youth.

Who may participate?

You must be a registered 4-H member to sell items in the Farmers Market. Since this is a 4-H activity, all participants should wear a white shirt with the 4-H patch on the shoulder.

What can I sell?

Garden produce, herbs, flowers and houseplants were among the items sold last year. Sorry, no prepared foods or crafts may be sold.

How much produce do I need to bring?

Youth may sell as little or much produce as they have grown. Large quantities of produce are not required to participate. Last year some youth arrived with only a small basket of various vegetables which they were able to market successfully.



When is the 4-H Farmer's Market?

The 4-H Farmers Market is on Friday night during the fair, this year it will be August 28. It will be open from 6pm-8pm.
