Instructions for Using the Online Fair Entry System

This instruction sheet will take you step by step through the process of entering exhibits using the Online Fair Entry System.

4-H Exhibit Entry Information Sheet

4-H Exhibit Entry Information Sheet is an optional form to help you gather information needed to enter exhibits online. It is also available at both USU Extension Offices.

Brief Overview of Steps in Entering Exhibits Online

- Step 1: Go to <https://utah4hreg.usu.edu/cf/>
- Step 2: Click on "HELP! I need a new password" to set up an account.
- Step 3: Enter your email and click the submit button. If your email is in our database you will be sent a temporary password (if we don't have your email please contact the USU Extension office (435 695-2542 or 1-877-390-2326) so we can add it so you will be able to do this step).
- Step 4: Check your email for the temporary password sent to you, then login using your email address and password.
- Step 5: Click on the Add Entries Tab. This is where you will input all indoor exhibits for your youth (this is for indoor exhibits only – **do not add animals or crops**). Select 4-H member from the list. Select class and lot for one exhibit they plan to enter. Under "Items" enter the number of items that need tags (2 tags for pajamas with top and bottom). Briefly describe the exhibit in a way that would help us find it. For example, blue skirt with ruffle, crayon drawing of duck, sugar cookies, etc. Click on "Add Entry". Repeat this process for each additional exhibit. Class and lot information is available in the Box Elder County Fair Book or online at <http://extension.usu.edu/boxelder> then 4-H Indoor Exhibits under Box Elder County Fair on the right side of the screen.
- Step 6: To View exhibits entered click on "View Entries".
- Step 7: Print exhibit tags by clicking on "View / Print Tags". The tags you print will be the tags displayed on the exhibit during the fair.
- Step 8: Print two lists of exhibits by clicking on "View / Print Entry Lists". Under the "Sort by" tab click on "Name" and print the list. Then click on "Class / Lot" and print the list.
- Step 9: On August 22nd or 23rd have 4-H members bring their exhibits to you. Use pins, tape, or rubber bands to attach tags to the exhibits when the exhibits arrive.
- Step 10: **At the Fairgrounds**
On August 23rd bring the exhibits to the 4-H area in the Home Arts building between **1 - 8 p.m.** **If you have entered exhibits online** take them directly to the entry tables and give the volunteer the lists of exhibits you printed. The volunteer will check off each exhibit you brought to the fair, add any exhibits that were not entered online, and cross off any exhibits that were not completed but were entered online.
If exhibits were not entered using the Online County Fair Entry System go to one of the computers near the north door and enter the exhibits there. **Crops and animals are not entered into the online county fair entry system. For crops and small animals use the entry form in the fair book.**



Fashion Workshops & 4-H Fashion Show

The 4-H Fashion Workshops will be held on Wednesday, August 3, 2011 and August 17, 2011 at Bridgerland Applied Technology College, 325 West 1100 South in Brigham City from 10 a.m. – 12 noon. On August 3rd you will learn the basics of modeling and how to present yourself with style.

You will also get to practice an interview with the judges and help plan the theme, etc. for the fashion show. On August 17th you will practice modeling, rehearse for the 4-H Fashion Show and decorate the stage.

If you are planning to participate in the Jr. Fashion Revue or Decorate Your Duds Contests or the 4-H Fashion Show, **please plan on attending** the workshops on both days so you will be well prepared for the contests and fashion show on August 18th. The 4-H Fashion Show will be held on August 18, 2011 at 6 p.m. at Bridgerland Applied Technology College, 325 West 1100 South in Brigham City.

Best 4-H Clothing Construction Award

The “*Best 4-H Clothing Construction Award*” is presented by Michael B. and Gloria Jensen to a 4-H member enrolled in a clothing project and exhibiting at the Box Elder County Fair. The award is given to promote quality clothing construction and to recognize youth who excel in sewing. The recipient of this award will receive a certificate and a \$50 savings bond.

All 4Hers in sewing/clothing projects are invited to participate in the 4-H Fashion Show. It will be held on August 18 from 6—7:00 p.m. at BATC, 325 W 1100 South in Brigham City. Friends and family are welcome to attend. Please plan to attend the Fashion Workshops on August 3 and 17 to prepare for the fashion show.

Junior Fashion Revue Contest

August 18th is the day for the Junior Fashion Revue Contest. Juniors (grades 3-5) and Intermediates (grades 6-8) in clothing projects are eligible to participate. In this contest each 4-Her makes and accessorizes an outfit and models it before the judges. Judges ask questions about how it was constructed, how it will be cared for, etc.

The contest will be held at the Bridgerland Applied Technology College, 325 West 1100 South in Brigham City. 4-H Small Animal Requirements for Fair Entry

In order to show rabbits, chickens and pigeons in the 4-H departments of the county fair, there is a requirement to attend six meetings if you are a member of the community club. If you have not met this requirement then your exhibit will be entered in the open division.

All 4-H small animal exhibitors 3rd—12th grades as of January 1 of the current year must turn in a record book when the project is checked in at the fair. In order to ensure that you have a pen, the entry form in the fair book is required. The entry forms are also available at www.boxeldercounty.org>Fair>Small Animals.

The entry form must be postmarked by August 15 or bring it into the fair office between August 15 - 19.



Attention 4-H Food Preservation Exhibitors

Please see the General Food Preservation Rules under Class ECC in the fair book as you prepare your exhibit/s for the fair. Also note that each jar should be labeled with the following information:

Name of exhibitor.

Name of recipe/source of recipe, i.e. Kerr, Ball, USDA, or pectin brand name.

Date Canned.

Processing method and time - water bath, pressure canner, using correct altitude adjustments for your area. Please contact Ann if you need additional information.
