❖ <i>Betula occidentalis</i>	water or river birch	None available
❖ <i>Cercis occidentalis</i>	California or western redbud	None known
❖ <i>Cercocarpus ledifolius</i>	curlleaf mountain-mahogany	None available
❖ <i>Cornus sericea</i>	red-osier or red-stemmed dogwood	'Cardinal' (bright red stems), 'Flaviramea' (yellow stems), 'Isanti' (bright red stems; compact), 'Kelseyi' (compact)
❖ <i>Cowania mexicana</i>	cliffrose, quininebush	None available
❖ <i>Fraxinus anomala</i>	single leaf ash or dwarf ash	None available
❖ <i>Juniperus osteosperma</i>	Utah Juniper	None
❖ <i>Pinus edulis</i>	pinyon, Colorado pinyon	None available
❖ <i>Pinus monophylla</i>	singleleaf pinyon	None available
❖ <i>Prunus virginiana</i>	common chokecherry	'Schubert' or 'Canada Red' (pyramidal form; red-green foliage)
❖ <i>Ptelea angustifolia</i>	common or western hoptree, wafer-ash	None available
❖ <i>Quercus gambelii</i>	Gambel, scrub, or Rocky Mountain white oak	None readily available
❖ <i>Quercus turbinella</i>	shrub live oak	None available
❖ <i>Quercus undulata</i>	wavyleaf oak	None available
❖ <i>Sambucus cerulea</i>	blue elder	None available
❖ <i>Sorbus scopulina</i>	Greene mountain-ash	None available
❖ <i>Yucca brevifolia</i>	Joshua-tree	None available
<i>Acer buergerianum</i>	trident maple	Dwarf and variegated cultivars available
<i>Acer ginnala</i>	Amur or Ginnala maple	'Compactum' (shrubby), 'Flame' (shrub to small tree; red fruits; deep red fall color)
<i>Acer griseum</i>	paperbark maple	Some hybrids available
<i>Acer palmatum</i>	Japanese maple	Numerous; var. <i>atropurpureum</i> and 'Bloodgood' 'Crimson Queen' (red, deeply lobed leaves), 'Viridis' (green leaves)(reddish-purple leaves), 'Rubrum' (deep red fall color)
<i>Acer tataricum</i>	Tatarian maple	Rubrum' (deep red fall color)
<i>Acer truncatum</i>	purpleblow or Shantung maple	Norway maple hybrids 'Norwegian Sunset' (upright-oval; heat tolerant), 'Pacific Sunset' (upright-spreading; red in fall)
<i>Amelanchier arborea</i>	downy serviceberry	'Autumn Sunset' (good orange fall color), 'Springtime' (good flowers and fall color; 12' tall)
<i>Catalpa bignonioides 'Nana'</i>	umbrella catalpa	'Nana' (sterile, grafted dwarf)
<i>Cercis canadensis</i>	eastern redbud, Judas-tree	var. <i>alba</i> (white flowers), 'Forest Pansy' (purple leaves), 'Silver Cloud' (white variegated leaves)
<i>Cornus alternifolia</i>	pagoda or alternate-leaf dogwood	'Argentea' (leaves with white variegations; shrubby)
<i>Cornus florida</i>	flowering dogwood	Numerous; 'Cherokee Chief' (red flowers), 'Cloud 9' (cold-hardy), var. <i>rubra</i> (pink-red flowers), 'World's Fair' (cold hardy; drought resistant)
<i>Cornus kousa</i>	Kousa dogwood	Numerous; var. <i>chinensis</i> (larger flowers and tree size), 'Dwarf Pink' (small tree; pink flowers), 'Fanfare' (upright form; very cold-hardy)

<b><i>Cornus mas</i></b>	corneliancherry dogwood	'Alba' (white fruit), 'Flava' (yellow fruit), 'Golden Glory' (heavy flowering), 'Nana', 'Variegata'
<b><i>Corylus americana</i></b>	American hazelnut	None known
<b><i>Corylus cornuta</i></b>	beaked hazelnut	None available
<b><i>Cotinus coggyria</i></b>	common smoketree, smokebush	'Flame' (good orange-red fall color), 'Pendulus' 'Royal Purple' (dark purple mature leaves)
<b><i>Crataegus crusgalli</i></b>	cockspur hawthorn	var. <i>inermis</i> (thornless), 'Hooks' (fewer thorns)
<b><i>Crataegus laevigata</i></b>	English hawthorn	'Crimson Cloud' (blight resistant), 'Paul's Scarlet' (red, doubled flowers; very showy)
<b><i>Crataegus phaenopyrum</i></b>	Washington hawthorn	'Clark' (heavy fruiting), 'Fastigiata', 'Vaughn' (hybrid with <i>C. crusgalli</i> ; heavy fruiting)
<b><i>Crataegus viridis</i></b>	green hawthorn	'Winter King' (vase-shaped; red fruit attractive in winter; excellent tree)
<b><i>Crataegus X lavalleyi</i></b>	Lavalle hawthorn	Hybrid of <i>C. stipulacea</i> and <i>C. crusgalli</i>
<b><i>Eriobotrya japonica</i></b>	loquat	'Golden Nugget' (large; abundant fruit), 'Variegata' (white variegations)
<b><i>Juniperus chinensis</i></b>	Chinese juniper	Numerous, all forms, sizes, and colors; includes 'Hetzii' (15' tall) and 'Pfitzeriana' (wide shrub)
<b><i>Laburnum X watereri</i></b>	goldenchain tree, Waterer laburnum	'Alford's Weeping', 'Aureum' (golden yellow leaves), 'Pendulum', 'Vossii' (dense crown; 2' long inflorescences)
<b><i>Lagerstroemia indica</i></b>	crapemyrtle	Numerous; 'Acoma' (white flowers; semi-dwarf), 'Hopi' (pink flowers; semi-dwarf), 'Yuma' (lavender flowers; taller, upright)
<b><i>Magnolia stellata</i></b>	star magnolia	'Centennial' (doubled flowers, pinkish), 'Dawn' (pink stripe on petal), 'Royal Star' (superior)
<b><i>Malus spp.</i></b>	crabapple	Numerous cultivars available
<b><i>Pinus mugo</i></b>	Mugo pine	'Compacta' (dense, round, 4' tall), 'Gnom' (15" tall by 3' wide), 'Mops' (3' tall by 3' wide), var. <i>mugo</i> (8' tall), var. <i>pumilio</i> (prostrate, 10' wide)
<b><i>Pistacia vera</i></b>	pistachio	Unknown
<b><i>Prunus cerasifera</i></b>	purpleleaf, cherry, or Myrobalan plum	'Newport' (dark purple leaves; more cold hardy), 'Thundercloud' (less cold hardy; pink flowers)
<b><i>Prunus domestica</i></b>	common plum	Numerous
<b><i>Prunus serrulata</i></b>	Japanese flowering or Oriental cherry	'Amanogawa' (narrow upright form), 'Kwanzan' (double flowers; often grafted at 4'-6')
<b><i>Syringa reticulata</i></b>	Japanese tree lilac	'Chantilly Lace' (leaf edges yellow), 'Ivory Silk' (flowers young, heavy), 'Regent' (vigorous; upright), 'Summer Snow' (heavy flowering)

❖ <i>Juniperus scopulorum</i>	Rocky Mountain Juniper	Numerous; many are blue; 'Pathfinder' (narrow pyramidal), 'Wichita Blue' (tall pyramidal)
❖ <i>Picea pungens</i>	blue or Colorado blue spruce	Numerous; 'Argentea' (silver-white needles), 'Glauca Globosa', 'Glauca Pendula', 'Hoopsii' (dense pyramidal), 'Mission Blue' (very blue)
❖ <i>Pinus flexilis</i>	limber pine	'Columnaris', 'Glauca Pendula', 'Nana', 'Pendula', 'Vandewolf's Pyramid' (upright; fast growth; blue)
❖ <i>Pseudotsuga menziesii</i>	Douglas-fir	'Fastigiata', 'Fletcheri' (6' dwarf), var. <i>glauca</i> (blue-green needles), 'Pendula'
<i>Acer campestre</i>	hedge maple	'Compactum' (shrubby), 'Fastigiatum', 'Queen Elizabeth' (small to medium size)
<i>Aesculus glabra</i>	Ohio buckeye	var. <i>nana</i> (dwarf, shrubby)
<i>Catalpa bignonioides</i>	southern catalpa	'Aurea', 'Nana' (see below)
<i>Cedrus libani</i>	cedar of Lebanon	'Argentea' (silver-blue), var. <i>brevifolia</i> (smaller than species), 'Pendula', 'Sargentii' (5' dwarf), var. <i>stenocoma</i> (more cold hardy; stiff)
<i>Chamaecyparis obtusa</i>	Hinoki falsecypress	'Crippsii' (broad, yellow-green), 'Filicoides' (shrubby; pendulous twigs), 'Gracilis' (dark green, narrow pyramid), 'Nana' (small shrub)
<i>Juniperus virginiana</i>	eastern redcedar	Numerous; 'Glauca', 'Globosa', 'Manhattan Blue' (compact pyramidal), 'Pendula'
<i>Magnolia X soulangiana</i>	saucer magnolia	'Brozzonii' (large white flowers open late), 'Lennei' (dark purple-pink petals; shrubby), 'San Jose' (large, pink-purple flowers; fast grower)
<i>Picea abies</i>	Norway spruce	Numerous; 'Nidiformis' (called "bird's nest spruce"; tight, spreading, shrubby), 'Pendula' (name for cultivars with weeping branchlets)
<i>Picea glauca</i>	white or Blackhills spruce	'Conica' or 'Dwarf Alberta' (very small, tight; tiny needles; common in Utah), 'Densata' (also called "Blackhills spruce"; tall, narrow; nice form)
<i>Picea omorika</i>	Serbian spruce	'Expansa' (wide shrub), 'Nana' (round or conical; 10' high), 'Pendula' (tall, narrow; branches droop)
<i>Pinus densiflora</i>	Japanese red pine	'Globosa' (round shrub to 10'-15'), 'Oculus-draconis' (yellow banded leaves), 'Pendula', 'Umbraculifera'
<i>Pinus nigra</i>	Austrian pine	'Hornibrookiana' (very compact dwarf, 6' wide and 2' high), 'Pyramidalis'
<i>Pinus parviflora</i>	Japanese white pine	'Bergman' (wide, rounded shrub), 'Brevifolia' (narrow crown; short needles), 'Glauca'
<i>Pinus strobus</i>	eastern white pine	'Compacta', 'Contorta' (irregular crown; twisted branches), 'Fastigiata', var. <i>glauca</i> , 'Pendula' (weeping crown)
<i>Pinus thunbergii</i>	Japanese black pine	'Compacta', 'Globosa', 'Iseli' (gold variegated; small), 'Majestic Beauty' (large tree; dark green)
<i>Thuja (Platyclusus) orientalis</i>	Oriental arborvitae	Numerous; 'Aurea Nana' (5'; round), 'Baker' (bright green; likes heat), 'Compacta' (small, pyramidal)
<i>Thuja occidentalis</i>	northern white-cedar, eastern arborvitae	Numerous; cold hardy include 'Emerald' and 'Nigra' (narrow pyramidal), 'Techny' (broad pyramidal)
