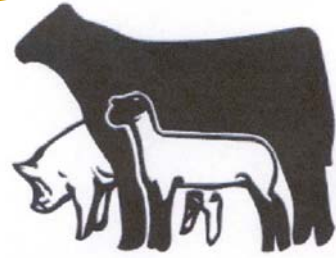

WAYS TO USE YOUR PURCHASE

Individuals obtain top quality beef, pork and lamb. Your friends and neighbors can share a purchase.

Businesses can use purchase for an employee barbeque, good will gifts, or resale to employees at market price.

Organizations may auction off wrapped meat as a fund raiser or use the purchase for a club barbeque.

APPROXIMATE WEIGHT THE BUYER RECEIVES BEFORE PACKAGING

BEEF - 1,200 lb. live steer will yield an average 745 lb. carcass.

SWINE - 230 lb. live market hog will yield an average 166 lb. carcass.

SHEEP - 120 lb. live market lamb will yield an average 64 lb. carcass.

TWO WAYS TO PARTICIPATE

- (1) Attend the sale in person. The excitement of the event, the drama of the auctioneer's cry creates an unforgettable scene. Auction officials will gladly assist you.
- (2) If you are unable to attend but wish to participate, you can do so by proxy. Just fill out the bid slip or contact a member of the sale committee.

HOW IS A PURCHASE MADE?

- Register with sales table when you arrive. Get your buyer number.
- When you wish to place a bid on the animal in the ring, raise your hand until the ring man acknowledges your bid.
- Bids are based on dollars per head. The buyer is the highest bidder.
- Upon being recognized as the buyer, you will be asked for the name of the business or group which you represent. (Business cards are encouraged to assure proper recognition by the auctioneer.)
- A representative of the auction committee will bring a sales receipt to you. You will verify the sale price and indicate what you wish to do with the animal.
- The Sale Committee reserves the right to refuse any bid.

HOW TO PAY FOR YOUR PURCHASE

Payment is encouraged the day of the sale.

WAYS TO BUY

Home Use – You can purchase the entire animal for home use. You pay the total sale price bid at the time of the sale. You will need to designate at the time of the sale whether or not you wish to have your animal processed for home use. Simply indicate on your slip who you want to do the processing. Bid price does not include processing fees.

Buy Back – Buyers not wanting to keep their purchased animal pay only the difference between the final bid price and resale value listed in the program based on the floor prices set by livestock markets. The floor buyer (packer) will take the animal and the successful bidder pays only the support amount. The floor price will be set prior to the sale and will be published in the sale program. For example, suppose you bid \$370 for a 100 pound lamb. The floor price is \$.70/lb, the buy back price is then \$70. Your cost = \$300.

Split Buying – Two or more individuals, families, businesses, or organizations may wish to split the cost of an animal. This reduces the cost to any one person or group and reduces the amount of meat each will receive. Notify the auctioneer of the combination of bidders at the time of bidding or at registration.

Buyers' Pool - Individuals and/or businesses commit a dollar amount to the pool. The buyers' pool will then bid on and purchase animals, leveraging the available money to maximize the benefit to participating youth.

For Donation - Donate the meat from your purchase to one or more non-profit organizations. Youth benefit from your support, you get the promotion and satisfaction of knowing that your favorite organization gets the meat. You may also donate the processing fees or arrange with the recipient to pay the processing fees.
