



PREMIUMS

1. Cash Premiums will be given only where listed, otherwise ribbons will be given as premiums. All premiums must be claimed prior to October 1 or be forfeited.
2. The department supervisors will attach ribbons indicating the award to the article as soon as the award is made. The award of premiums will be designated as follows: First premium by a blue ribbon; Second Premium by a red ribbon; Third Premium by a white ribbon.
3. Where a single animal is exhibited, the judges will award prizes according to the quality of the exhibit. Each exhibitor is limited to two monies per class. When articles or animals are not deemed worthy or where there is no competition, premiums will be awarded according to the judges discretion. On sweepstakes, they will give the award to the animals, group, or exhibit they deem the best type representation of the breed or class.
4. No person will be allowed in the ring while stock are being judged except judges, supervisors, and necessary attendants. Any person in any department attempting to influence the judges in their decision in any way or approaching them while they are judging, for any cause, unless asked for information, will forfeit all premiums awarded and will be excluded from competing and exhibition.

Heifers

1. Junior Heifer Calf – born after March 1, 2009.
2. Winter Heifer—born December 2008, January or February 2009.
3. Fall Heifer – born September, October, or November 2008.
4. Summer Yearling Heifer - born June, July, or August 2008.
5. Spring Yearling Heifer – born March, April, or May 2008.
6. Winter Yearling Heifer - born December, 2007, January or February 2008.
7. Fall Yearling Heifer - born September, October, or November 2007 (non-fresh).

8. Junior Best Three Females – Fall yearling and under. All bred and at least one owned by exhibitor (one entry per farm).
9. Milking Fall Yearling - born Sept, October, or November 2007.
10. Junior Two-Year-Old Cows (must have freshened) – born between March 1, 2007 and August 31, 2007.

11. Senior Two-Year-Old Cow – born between September 1, 2006 and February 28, 2007.
12. Junior Three-Year-Old Cow – born between March 1, 2006 and August 31, 2006.
13. Senior Three-Year-Old Cow – born between September 1, 2005 and February 28, 2006.
14. Four-Year-Old Cow – born between September 1, 2004 and August 31, 2005.
15. Five-Year-Old Cow – born between September 1, 2003 and August 31, 2004.
16. Aged Cows – born before September 1, 2003.
17. Dry Cows – any age (must have freshened once).
18. Grand Ole Dam - born prior to September 1, 2000 or 125,000 pounds of milk by last test date.

19. Senior Best Three Females – three senior females all bred and at least one owned by exhibitor (one entry per farm).
20. Breeders Herd – This group, all owned or bred by the exhibitor, consists of two females over two years of age, two females under two years of age, one female of any age. Three must be bred by the exhibitor. (one entry per farm).
21. Produce of Dam – 2 animals, any age, either sex, the produce on one cow (one entry per farm).
22. Progeny Class – consists of dam and 1 progeny, either sex (one entry per farm).
23. Premier Exhibitor’s Award - The exhibitor winning the most points on, not to exceed six animals owned, will be exhibited by himself in the open single classes and shall be designated the Premier Exhibitor. The scale of points will be the same as that for determining Premier Breeder.
24. Premier Breeders Award - The breeder winning the most points on six animals with the same prefix.
25. DHIA Grand Performer Award - Award presented by Rocky Mountain DHIA. Latest individual DHIA cow page must be brought to show to enter animals. Score based on last

completed lactation of 180 days or more and show placings.

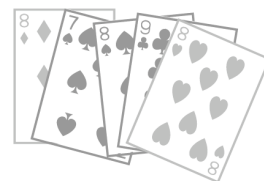
For entrance requirements and barn rules of Beef Cattle, refer to general livestock rules. All major breeds of beef cattle will be recognized and shown in their breed classes. Junior registered breeding beef will be judged Friday morning as part of Breeding Beef Show.

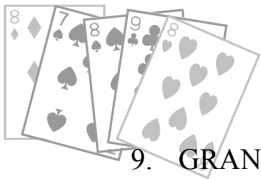
Judging will start with younger animals beginning at 9:00 a.m., Friday.

Premiums will be paid as follows:

1. Heifer calves, calved after March 1, 2009.
2. Heifers, Junior Calves – calved January or February 2009.
3. Heifers, Winter Calves – 9 to 11 months, calved October, November, or December 2008.
4. Heifers, Senior Calves – calved August or September 2008.
5. Heifers– calved May, June, or July 2008.
6. Heifers calved March or April 2008.
7. Heifers, Junior Yearlings – 18 to 19 months, calved January or February 2008.
8. Aged female, calved before December 31, 2007 and after July 1, 2007.





9. **GRAND CHAMPION FEMALE** – To be selected from the calf, yearling, and aged class champions. Rosette.
10. **RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION FEMALE** – To be selected from the remaining calf, yearling, or aged champions that were named Grand Champion. Rosette.
11. Bull calves born after March 1, 2008.
12. Bulls, Junior Calves – under 9 months, calved January or February 2008.
13. Bulls calved October, November, December 2007.
14. Bulls, Senior Calves – 12 to 13 months, calved August or September 2007.
15. Bulls, Summer Yearlings – 14 to 16 months, calved May, June, or July 2007.
16. Bulls, Spring Yearlings – 17 to 18 months, calved March or April 2007.
Note: Entries in Classes 14 & 15 will be combined and then divided by age into two classes of equal number if sufficient entries are available.
17. Bulls, Junior Yearlings – 19 to 20 months, calved January or February 2007.
18. Bulls, Senior Yearlings – 21 to 25 months, calved August through December 2006.
19. Bulls, Two-Year-Olds – 26 to 32 months, calved January through July 2006.
20. **GRAND CHAMPION BULL** – Selected from the calf, yearling, and senior champions. Rosette.
21. **RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION BULL** – Selected from the remaining calf, yearling, or senior champion, plus the bull that stood reserve to the calf, yearling, or senior champion that was named Grand Champion. Rosette.
22. **PAIR OF BULLS**
23. **PAIR OF HEIFERS**
24. **GET OF SIRE** – Three animals shown in above single entry classes with both sexes represented, but with no more than two females and all to be the progeny of one sire. There is no ownership requirement in this class.
25. **BEST THREE HEAD (OWNED BY EXHIBITOR)** – All animals must have been shown in their respective single entry classes and they must be owned by the exhibitor or a member of his immediate family.
26. **PRODUCE OF DAM** – Two animals shown in above single entry classes of same sexes or one of each sex.
27. Commercial heifers - calves under 9 months calved on or after January 1, 2008.
28. Commercial heifers - calved between January 1, 2007 to December 31, 2007.
Note: If commercial heifer classes 27 and 28 are sufficient in numbers we will divide them by age into two equal classes.
29. Commercial female born before December 31, 2007.

1. Birds will be received at the Fairgrounds Wednesday, from 10:00 to 4:00 p.m. Entries close when cages are full!
2. All entries must be properly banded. Band numbers must be registered in the books of the secretary before the list has been given to the judge and cannot be changed thereafter. Leg bands may be obtained from supervisor for a small charge.
3. Judging will begin at 9:00 a.m., Thursday, and will be closed to the public. All specimens entered shall be under the control of the superintendent. He will place birds in the show room according to instructions of the commit-

tee in charge and no birds shall be removed from the cages without his consent.

4. No diseased bird shall be admitted to the show room. Any stock arriving sick will be returned to the owner. A competent veterinarian will check all birds in the show room each day and all sick birds will be removed and placed in quarantine.
5. No prizes will be awarded to exhibits that are disqualified and improperly classed or if the judge regards them unworthy of a prize.
6. Definition of exhibits:
 Single Bird – Cock, Hen, Cockerel, Pullet.
 Cock Bird – A male bird one year old or over.
 Hen – A female bird over one year old.
 Cockerel – A male bird under one year old.
 Pullet – A female bird under one year old.
 Old Trio – A Cock and two Hens.
 Young Trio – A cockerel and two Pullets.
 Best Display – consists of a cock, cockerel, hen pullet, and trio, either young or old in one class.
