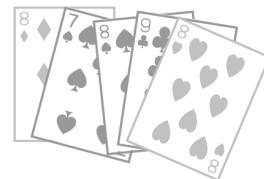
1. Birds will be received at the Fairgrounds Wednesday, from 10:00 to 4:00 p.m. Entries close when cages are full!
2. All entries must be properly banded. Band numbers must be registered in the books of the secretary before the list has been given to the judge and cannot be changed thereafter. Leg bands may be obtained from supervisor for a small charge.
3. Judging will begin at 9:00 a.m., Thursday, and will be closed to the public. All specimens entered shall be under the control of the superintendent. He will place birds in the show room according to instructions of the commit-

tee in charge and no birds shall be removed from the cages without his consent.

4. No diseased bird shall be admitted to the show room. Any stock arriving sick will be returned to the owner. A competent veterinarian will check all birds in the show room each day and all sick birds will be removed and placed in quarantine.
5. No prizes will be awarded to exhibits that are disqualified and improperly classed or if the judge regards them unworthy of a prize.
6. Definition of exhibits:
 Single Bird – Cock, Hen, Cockerel, Pullet.
 Cock Bird – A male bird one year old or over.
 Hen – A female bird over one year old.
 Cockerel – A male bird under one year old.
 Pullet – A female bird under one year old.
 Old Trio – A Cock and two Hens.
 Young Trio – A cockerel and two Pullets.
 Best Display – consists of a cock, cockerel, hen pullet, and trio, either young or old in one class.

8. Pens and singles can compete for champions. All of the awards shall be made in accordance with the revised edition of the American Standard of Perfection.
9. No birds can be moved under any circumstances until checked out by the superintendent. Show check-out time is 8:00 p.m., Saturday.





CHICKENS SHOW INFORMATION

Thank you for entering your bird[s] in the Cache County Fair Chicken Show. The following are some guidelines and information that might come in handy, or answer any questions you might have during the show.

1. If you are entering your bird, and you are a Jr. Exhibitor (under 18), please write Jr. on the exhibitor list and on the cage card so that we will be aware of how many junior exhibitors are exhibiting and who they are. All exhibitors need to make sure that all of the proper paperwork is filled out and given to the proper authorities. We recommend that boxes or carriers be taken with you after entering your birds, then brought back when picking up birds, this helps keep area looking nicer and prevents loss of property.
2. We are asking that all birds are old enough to be entered in the show. They need to be feathered out in their adult plumage, if there is any question please do not bring your bird. If your bird shows any sign of illness or parasites please do not exhibit it. Shows can be stressful and if birds are in a weakened condition it could be lethal. This is also a courtesy to other exhibitors so that no other birds are exposed to disease or parasites.
3. We will be prejudging birds before entering. Birds not deemed worthy of being judged will not be entered. i.e.-clipped wings, not standard breed, parasites or illness, disqualifying features, etc.
4. When determining how many birds to enter, please consider quality of birds versus quantity of birds. We may limit the number of birds entered per individual or family.
5. Judging of the birds will take place Thursday morning starting at 9:00. It usually takes most of the morning to complete the judging. No one will be allowed in the aisles during the judging so that the judge will be able to complete his assignment in a timely matter. If after the judging you have questions about the judging process, why your bird placed as it did, or what could be done differently so that your birds places better in the future, please talk to one of the committee members, we would be more than happy to explain the process to you, and to talk to you about your birds. This is especially helpful if you are just getting started in chickens or if you have a youngster just getting started.
6. The show committee will not be involved in the selling or buying of birds. If birds are offered for sale, it will be the responsibility of the seller to complete the transaction.
7. During the duration of the show you are welcome to visit your bird as often as you would like, we will take care of feeding and watering. We ask that you leave your bird in the cage so that there isn't any confusion as to where the bird goes.
8. Premium money slips can be picked up from a member of the committee. They will need to be signed for when picked up, they can then be turned in to the proper people so that prize money can be collected. Times and places for reimbursement are printed on the premium slips. It is very helpful if you can take care of this during the fair.
9. Check out time starts at 8 p.m. Saturday night. No birds will be allowed out before this time. Any birds remaining after 11:00 p.m. Saturday night become the property of the committee unless prior arrangements have been made.
