Please read the following and sign at the bottom:

- Irrigation water is not available until the first week of June. Organizations affiliated with the CVCG and/or Nibley City have no authority to turn the water on before this. You may be able to plant earlier than this date, but you are responsible for hauling water until irrigation water is available.
- Automatic, overhead irrigation water is provided in a regular and timely manner. However, you are solely responsible for ensuring plants in your plot are properly irrigated.
- For various reasons, the irrigation system may require repair or maintenance and may not operate at all times. Reasonable efforts will be made to contact gardeners when this occurs. However, CVCG and affiliated organizations are not responsible or liable for plant damage or loss due to irrigation system deficiencies or breaks.
- You are responsible for your plot upkeep. Weeds are a natural part of gardening and must be regularly removed. As long as weeds are removed in a timely manner, an excellent garden can be raised.
- Use of mulch, compost, organic matter, etc. is encouraged. It can improve the soil and improve vegetable yields.
- CVCG is not strictly organic. We do adhere to principles of sustainable gardening and integrated pest management. Use of pest control products beyond poison-free containing traps, horticultural soap, neem oil and diamataceous earth must be pre-approved by CVCG management.
- Use of fertilizers is acceptable. We encourage the use of slow release fertilizers (Osmocote* type products), mild liquid-feed fertilizers (Miracle Gro* type products) or organic fertilizers.
- Plots must be cleaned by Saturday, October 22, 2011. Towards the end of the season a green waste dumpster will be available for spent garden plants. Failure to clean plots by the cutoff date will result in forfeiture of the cleaning deposit. No exceptions. Participants must report to the Extension Office their plot has been cleaned to obtain a refund of the cleaning deposit.
- On some occasions, surfaces at the community garden will be difficult to travel due to irrigation or rain. It is up to you to use caution at all times.
- For those who want to use the garden for more than one season consecutively, a permanent plot may be available for your use. Contact USU Cache County Extension if you are interested in doing so.
- Any inappropriate conduct, such a racial discrimination, use of offensive language or other forms of harassment, may result in immediate expulsion from the garden. Gardening fees will not be refunded in these situations. Incidences will additionally be reported to law enforcement, if deemed necessary.
