Dear First Step Camper:

We are excited about getting ready for First Step Camp on Monday, June 15, 2009. Youth need to attend First Step prior to attending Horse Camp. Youth cannot attend both camps in the same year. First Step will help you meet all of the safety and basic skill requirements so you can participate in other 4-H events in the future. It is a lot of fun for everyone.

Campers will be divided into groups according to ability and will be instructed by experience riders. Older 4-Hers and adults will be there to help younger youth saddle their horses.

At First Step Camp all participants will be able to pass off their Tenderfoot and Tenderfoot 2 ranks. In order to fulfill all of the requirements, each participant will need to bring with them a 200 word paper about the proper care and feeding of their horse. This must be the work of the camper.

Registration for First Step along with payment of \$20.00 per participant is due April 30, 2009 to the 4-H Office, 179 North Main, Suite 111, Logan, UT. Along with the registration form, please complete the Code of Conduct and Medical History forms. Any registrations received between May 1 and May 17 will be assessed a \$10 late fee. No applications will be accepted after May 17th.

Check in will begin at 8:00 AM on Monday June 15, 2009 at the North entrance to the Cache Fairgrounds. Enter off of 400 South at about 350 West.

All participants are reminded to have proper riding boots. Youth without proper equipment and boots will not be allowed to ride. Please dress appropriately for riding your horse. No tank tops will be allowed. Please make sure all of your equipment is in safe working condition and adjusted to the rider and to fit the horse used at first step.

If you plan to leave your horse trailer at the Fairgrounds during the day, you can tie your horse to it. You will need to bring a water bucket and a few flakes of hay. Please park trailers in designated areas.

Lunch will be provided. Your parents and family is invited to dinner at 6:00 PM prior to the final performance. The final performance will begin at 6:30 PM in the main outdoor arena. Parents are strongly encouraged to come and watch this event.
