




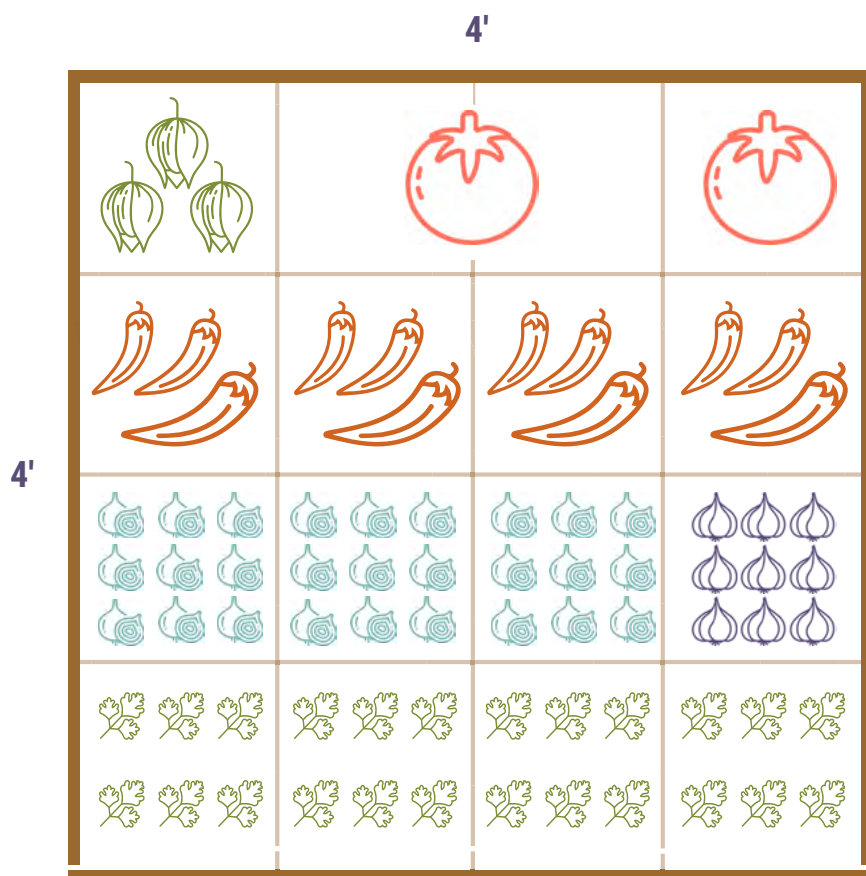
HOW TO PLANT A SALSA GARDEN

Use the following guide to plant a summer garden that will produce the necessary ingredients to prepare easy and delicious homemade salsas.

	PLANTING	WATERING	FERTILIZING
GARLIC 	Cloves, 2-3 inches deep	1-2 inches, every 7 days	Fertilize each garlic row with 1 tbsp. nitrogen fertilizer. Add fertilizer every 3 weeks and water into soil.
ONIONS 	Seeds, 1/4-1/2 inch deep	1-2 inches, every 7 days	3 weeks after planting, fertilize each onion row with 1 tbsp. of nitrogen fertilizer. Add fertilizer every 3 weeks and water into soil.
TOMATILLOS 	Use transplants	1-2 inches, once or twice a week	1/2 tbsp. nitrogen fertilizer per plant at weeks 4 and 8 after planting. Apply in circle around plant and water into soil.
TOMATOES 	Use transplants	1-2 inches, once or twice a week	1/2 tbsp. nitrogen fertilizer per plant at weeks 4 and 8 after planting. Place fertilizer 6 inches to the side of the plant and water into soil.
PEPPERS 	Use transplants	1-2 inches, once or twice a week	1/4 tbsp. nitrogen fertilizer per plant at weeks 4 and 8 after planting, Place fertilizer 6 inches to the side of the plant and water into soil.
CILANTRO 	Seeds, 1/4 -1/2 inch deep	Regular watering until plant grows	1 tbsp. nitrogen fertilizer per row, once or twice per growing season.

HOW TO PLANT A SALSA GARDEN



GARLIC



3-4 inches apart in row, with rows 3-4 inches apart

ONIONS



3-4 inches apart in row, with rows 3-4 inches apart

TOMATILLOS



24-36 inches apart in row, with rows 36 inches apart

TOMATOES



18 inches apart in row, with rows 24-36 inches apart

PEPPERS



18 inches apart in row, with rows 18-24 inches apart

CILANTRO



2 inches apart in row, with rows 6 inches apart
