

If you think someone is overdosing, call **9-1-1**. The Good Samaritan Law enables bystanders to report an overdose without fear of criminal prosecution for possession of controlled substances.

Naloxone is a safe antidote to opioids that has <u>no risk of</u> <u>abuse</u> and will not help or harm someone if they are overdosing on another drug. To find Naloxone in your area, visit <u>opidemic.utah.gov</u>




