Japan - Jan-Ken-Pon Game (otherwise known as rock, paper, scissors)

Objective: to introduce the students to Japanese culture through a game

Grade Level: Kindergarten and Elementary

Procedure:

- 1. Two players needed, sitting opposite one another.
- 2. Both players shout (say) Jen-Ken-Pon.
- 3. On Pon, they thrust one hand each out that is either flat (paper), a closed fist (rock), or with 2 extended fingers (scissors).
- 4. The students determine the winner in the following way: stone wins by breaking scissors; scissors win by cutting paper; and paper wins by covering stone.
- 5. Repeat the game ten times, counting how many times each player wins.

Japan - Mukade Kyoso Game

Objective: to introduce the students to Japanese culture through a game

Grade Level: Kindergarten and Elementary

Procedure:

- 1. Divide the class into 2-3 teams of 5-10 students on the playground or in a gym.
- 2. Mark a start and a finish line about 25-30 yards apart.
- 3. Organize each team into a line and tie their RIGHT legs together, front to back so that they form a long line like a many-legged centipede.
- 4. Explain to the students that the objective is to walk, in unison, from the start line to the finish line before the other teams do.
- 5. Teacher starts the race and the first complete team/centipede to cross the finish line wins.
