Japan - Kite Making

Objective: To build a kite, by following directions, that will demonstrate a common activity for Japanese children.

This lesson will also demonstrate how wind can be used as a source of energy for different activities.

Grade Level: Kindergarten and Elementary

Materials:

White Plastic Garbage Bag or a piece of rice/butcher paper Markers - permanent for plastic Wooden Dowels - 2 x 16"
Packing Tape
Kite String
Cloth for Tails

Procedure:

- measure and cut the garbage bag or paper in a square shape that has diagonal dimensions of 20"
- 2. decorate the kite with markers
- 3. tape the dowels into an X shape
- 4. attach tape to the corners of the kite (square) to reinforce them
- 5. attach the kite to the dowels by taping the corners
- 6. punch holes in two opposite corners of the kite
- 7. tie string through the two holes, the string should be 30" long
- 8. make a loop in the center of the string you just attached
- 9. tie a flying string to this loop and go fly your kite
