Bylaw Changes

These are the items that were voted yes as changes to the bylaws. Please read them carefully and let me know if you have any questions.

Members and parents/guardians must attend at least 1 horse council meeting and a Pre-show meeting to be eligible to show OR pay a \$50 per member Non-Participation fee. If you fail to meet either of these 2 requirements the Non-Participation fee must be paid before you are eligible to participate in a horse show.

Points earned through completing a portfolio at the second and fourth show will be added for end of year awards, Region and State Qualifications, but a portfolio is not required to show at the county level.

Youth are required to participate in at least 1 fundraiser that supports the whole county program to be eligible to receive their year end awards. Eligible club fundraisers qualify if the proceeds come back to the county program.

When choosing exhibition barrel races, rank exhibitors with the fastest average barrel time from the top 3 times from 3 shows.
