**It is time to sign-up for English Horse Camp 2016!** Please read through this information sheet thoroughly and in its entirety. Included with this letter you will find your Application for the Cache County English Horse Camp, Horse Camp Rules and Regulations, and a Code of Conduct-Member Agreement-Parent/Guardian Agreement Form. **Dates:** The dates for camp are Tuesday June 7<sup>th</sup> - Thursday, June 9<sup>th</sup>. Stall set-up and assignment is Tuesday, June 6<sup>th</sup>, promptly at 7:00 am. The last day of camp, Thursday, June 9<sup>th</sup>, the campers will participate in an English Schooling/Horse Show. A final schedule will be sent out after registration to confirm the schedule.

**Theme:** This camp is tailored for those who want to practice English Riding. Teaching and classes are based on 4-H goals for the English Program. This will vary from standard Pony Club classes, heights, and patterns. Meals at camp will be potluck-style for lunch and dinner, with 4-H supplying the "meat". Breakfast will be continental-style provided by 4-H. Snacks and beverages will also be provided. Potluck assignments for desserts and side dishes will be mailed out in the camp confirmation letter. Volunteers are invited to eat meals with the campers. There will be a \$10 fee, which covers the entire camp, for each family member who stays at camp and eats their meals with the 4-H campers. There will be a dinner/awards presentation the final evening of camp, after the schooling show is completed. There is no cost for any family members who come to this dinner/awards presentation. Families are invited to camp out in designated areas. If a family does not have camping accommodations for sleeping, a fairground building will be available for sleeping. Showers are available.

**Eligibility:** This year we are allowing youth in their first year of 4-H to participate in the English 4-H Horse camp **if** they have successfully passed off Tenderfoot Ranks I and II, **AND** have a parent/adult present at camp to assist them. (**All other camp participants** must also have completed the Tenderfoot Ranks I and II, and **must** be signed off by their 4-H club leader - not their parent). All riders **must** be able to proficiently walk/trot if doing ground poles, and able to walk/trot/canter if jumping. This camp is based on riders already having basic riding/horsemanship skills, so they can advance their English riding skills. If riders are beginners and still having difficulty with walk/trot, they will be better served by attending First Step Camp on June 20<sup>th</sup>.

Riders will be assessed by the instructors the first morning of camp to see if their riding ability and horse's ability supports the jumping height for which they have pre-registered. While we understand riders/horses may have managed to jump certain heights in the past, the instructors may feel decreasing the jumping height may improve their technique or be in the best interest/safety of the rider's/horse's ability.

**Fees & Requirements:** For Cache County 4-H Horse Club members, the price for Horse Camp is \$65 per camper. For all other counties, the cost is \$75. The camp will be limited to 30 riders. **ABSOLUTELY NO APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER FRIDAY MAY 13<sup>th</sup>**. This is to allow enough time to order camp shirts, food, and set the final volunteer and instruction schedule. There is an additional separate fee of \$75 that will be refunded at the end of camp if all criteria regarding stall set up, take down, clean up around trailers, participation in general camp/dorm clean up and volunteer positions are met by the camper. All campers will be **required** to supply parent or adult volunteer(s). A sign-up sheet for volunteer positions will be mailed with your camp confirmation letter after all applications are turned in.

**Performance shirts:** Each camper will receive a free camp performance shirt. If you want an extra shirt for your camper for another family member, please order it on the Horse Camp Application. Extra shirts are \$20 each, and must be paid for with the returned Horse Camp Application form. (Shirt fee can be added to the \$65/\$75 camp fee on the same check.)

**Horses:** All horses must be immunized to attend camp, worming and resetting of shoes or trimming within 4 weeks of camp. **Immunization Records or Vet Note with dates of immunization must be brought to camp and presented at sign in.** All horses will be inspected at camp registration before being allowed in their stalls. Horses showing signs of sickness, distress, or not properly cared for (this includes trimming or shoeing) will not be allowed to participate in camp. Cache County enforces Biosecurity temperature monitoring recommendations developed with the Utah State Veterinarian office and with the USU Equine Veterinarians. Data sheet for temps will be sent with confirmation information. Participants must bring records of AM and PM rectal horse temps for Friday June 3<sup>rd</sup>-Monday June 6<sup>th</sup>. This sheet will need to be brought to camp with recorded temps. Horse temps will also be taken when signing in on Tuesday June 7<sup>th</sup>, and each morning at camp. Participant will need to bring their own thermometer and be able to temp their own horse.

**Equipment:** An equipment list for the classes will be included in your camp confirmation letter. English tack is preferred, but Western tack will be accepted, but rider will be limited to ground poles only. Any participants who will be jumping, **must** have English saddle and tack.

English attire for the Schooling Show is requested. Polo shirt, (or camp performance shirt), breeches, (can be stretch pants), belt, English boots or half chaps, and 4-H patch. Jackets may be worn, but not required.

**Forms: Please register through ut.4honline.com by May 13, 2016** or return the paper registration form to the Cache County 4-H office by 5:00 pm on May 13, 2016.

**4-H English Horse Camp 2016 Rules & Regulations**

- All Campers must wear riding boots with heels while riding.
- Long pants, jeans, or britches for riding- no shorts for riding.
- All campers are asked to stay at camp at all times.
- If for any reason a camper needs to leave, they must sign a release and give to one of the co-chairs.
- Campers found to have left camp without permission will not be allowed back to camp.
- Campers are not allowed to drive while at camp.
- Appropriate clothing is to be worn at all times. Suggestive or revealing clothing is not allowed. No tank tops.
- Cell phone will be allowed, but you can only use cell phones (this includes text message) at appropriate times. No cell phones during instructional time or when activities are being conducted. Cell phones are not allowed when riders are on their horses. Cell phones will be confiscated and returned at the end of camp if you are using them at these times.
