



# CACHE COUNTY 4-H RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 4-Hers who compete in our the Cache County 4-H program cannot compete in any other county 4-H program, regardless of program area.
- 4-Hers must be enrolled in an active club.
- 4-Hers must attend at least 6 meetings in the 4-H year (September-August).
- 4-Hers must pay the \$10 registration fee or fill out the fee waiver in order to participate in 4-H events, clubs, and the fair.
- 4-Hers must be in 3rd grade and 8 years old by September 1st of that 4-H year in order to participate in animal projects or shooting sports.
- Clubs must have at least 5 kids from 3 different families.
- Clubs must have at least 6 meetings throughout the 4-H year for club members to attend.
- 4-H volunteers must complete the training process and get a background check.
- 4-Hers interested in participating in the 2024 Cache County Jr. Livestock Show MUST attend at least 2 education clinics.
- Due to past incidents with physical violence and threats, the Cache County 4-H Horse Program has been advised to abstain from hosting any state horse events. Secondly, due to Utah State University 4-H policy and liability concerns, only Cache County youth will be permitted to participate in county specific horse events.
