# Other Reasons Weeds Are Bad?

- A plant is usually considered a weed when it interferes with beneficial uses of land or water.
- Affects animal health.



- Weed aggressively compete for moisture.
- Nutrients
- Space
- Sunlight







- In water they can hinder fish growth and reproduction.
- Promote mosquito production.
- Hinder boating, fishing, and swimming.
- Clog irrigation ditches, drainage ditches, and channels.

Release toxins in the soil which inhibit growth of desirable plants.



- Skin and eye irritants.
- Poison to humans.











 Obscure vision on right-of-ways by blocking signs, guideposts, crossroads.

Increase mowing costs

Hinder travel



- Displaces desirable or native plants.
- Increase fire potential and frequency.





Contaminate agriculture products, Harbor pest insects, mites, vertebrates, or plant disease agents



#### Other Facts!

- Invasive weeds typically invade where human activities have caused disturbances.
- Such as road construction, non-intensive farming, poorly managed grazing or logging, urban development, and high impact recreation.

#### Natural Disturbances.

Large natural disturbances such as drought, fires, and floods may also play a role in the spread of invasive plants.










State Noxious Weed Law




