




- Statewide strategy for addressing suicide prevention in the LGBTQ+ community

Using someone's correct pronouns creates an inclusive environment and shows that you respect that person, the same way it's respectful to use someone's correct name.

GENDER IDENTITY

- Individual's deeply held sense of being male, female, or another gender
- Cisgender or Transgender

SEX


Physical Attributes

Gender Identities

- Cisgender gender identity is the same as medically assigned gender
- Transgender gender identity differs from medically assigned gender
 - Transgender Woman, Transgender Man, MTF, FTM
 - Non-binary/Gender nonconforming gender identity is neither male or female
 - Combination
 - Neither (Agender)

What is a pronoun?

Pronouns are the ways in which we refer to one another in the third person.



Why Should WE care?

Risk Factors	Transgender Respondents	U.S. Population
Poverty	29%	14%
Serious Psychological Distress in past 30 days	39%	5%
Suicide Attempt – Lifetime	40%	4.6%
Nonmedical Prescription Drug Use	7%	2%
Negative experience related to being transgender in health care setting	33%	n/a
Did not seek needed health care due to fear of being mistreated as a transgender person	23%	n/a

Protective Factors for transgender people

- Low internalized transphobia
- Fewer fears of gender-related rejection
- Taking steps to transition
- Social Support

What are my pronouns?

Gender Identity	Potential Pronouns	Example
Cisgender/Transgender Woman	She/Her/Hers	Sally is going to buy herself a new car.
Cisgender/Transgender Man	He/Him/His	John enjoys swimming with his siblings in the summer.
Non-Binary/Gender Non- conforming person	They/Them/Theirs Ze/Hir/Hirs	Alex wants to be an astronaut when they grow up. Casey washed hir hair last night.

Listen to others



What if I make a mistake???


- We all make mistakes when speaking, especially with language we're unfamiliar with
- If you misgender someone, apologize and move on
- Normalize all gender identities by not stopping conversation to draw attention to the mistake





Don't make it a bigger deal by over-explaining or over-apologizing.

Do take the time to correct your mistake, and then move on.



LET'S TALK ABOUT NAMES

- Some transgender people choose to go by a name that is different from the name given at birth
 - "Dead name"
 - "Government name"
- Inappropriate questions:
 - "What is your real name?"
 - "How did you choose your name?"

Final Thoughts

- We all make mistakes when we speak!
- Practice!! Ask a friend to help correct you when you make a mistake
- Ask *everyone* their pronouns, regardless of whether you assume you know what their gender identity is
- Don't rely on the transgender people you work with to correct you every time.
- Follow the lead of a transgender person (they might not be out!)
