The minutes of the annual meeting held December 15, 1970, were read and approved. The financial statement was audited, read and approved. The secretary also quoted from the national secretary's letter, indicating retirees prior to or during 1971 could become lifetime members by paying \$2.50 prior to December 31, 1971. Regular membership dues would be \$3.00 per year, starting in 1972. Twenty retirees have paid lifetime membership.

Ann Stenquist played several violin selections.

Vice-president Clark Ballard reported on the national meeting held on November 7. He stated there were thirty states represented. The special function of the organization is to promote professionalism. He asked, "How active are we?" There were two things we could do, he said, "fold up" or get on the ball and he suggested "we get at it." He suggested we give special recognition to the charter members at next year's meeting.

The national organization has been working on many things of value to all extension workers. Some of these are:

- Lobbying for extension interest
- Revenue sharing legislation
- Consideration to become members before 5 years of service
- Recognition and awards programs for extension
- Loans, grants, and scholarships for schooling up to \$1000.00
- Need for trainees in extension
- Retirement program--some states do not belong to the national system. They are trying also to get other service with other agencies to count toward retirement and are constantly working for better retirement programs.

He went on to suggest the history of the Iota Chapter be brought up-to-date, including emeriti and other retired members, that one of these members be appointed to work with the officers each year and they be involved in activities, be a task force in writing history, etc. He also indicated that he would find funds or secretarial help to carry out this activity, if needed.


Jessie Eller stated that she had a lot of material of A.E. Smith, which might be of interest in compiling the history.

It was moved by Darrell Stokes and seconded by Wayne Rose and passed that the officers develop a format to bring the life histories up-to-date. This might include a photostat copy of material on hand to be sent to each member to assist them in bringing histories up-to-date.

It was moved by Marden Broadbent and seconded by Anson Call and passed that a task force be appointed to investigate scholarships to trainees or extension workers, including summer or winter schools. To be included in the duties of the task force would be to work out recommendations for awards to individuals or counties with greatest interest in extension.

Wayne Ross, Ruth Coates, and Paul Daniels of the nomination committee passed ballots. Melvin Burningham was elected vice-president and Amy Kearsley, historian. Ray Thatcher was moved to president and Ray Burtenshaw was to serve as secretary for another two years.

The historical report was made by historian Anson Call and passed.


