## PURPOSE

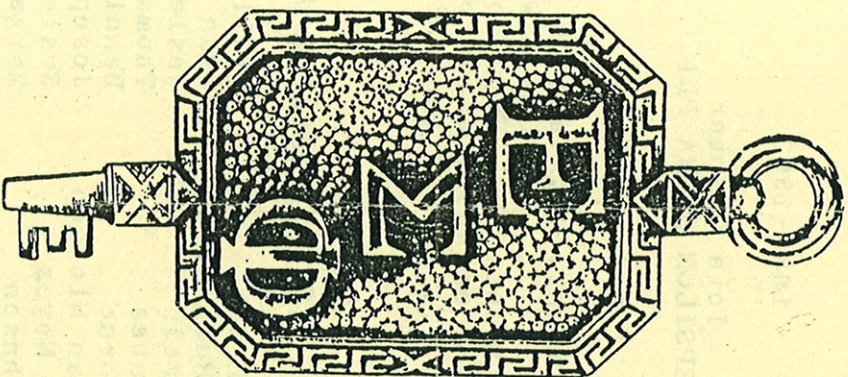

## THE EMBLEM
