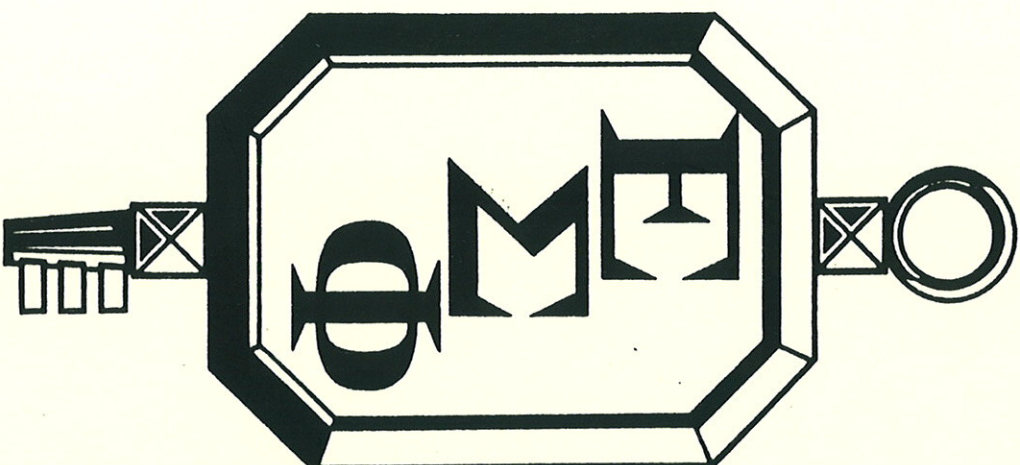
## THE EMBLEM
