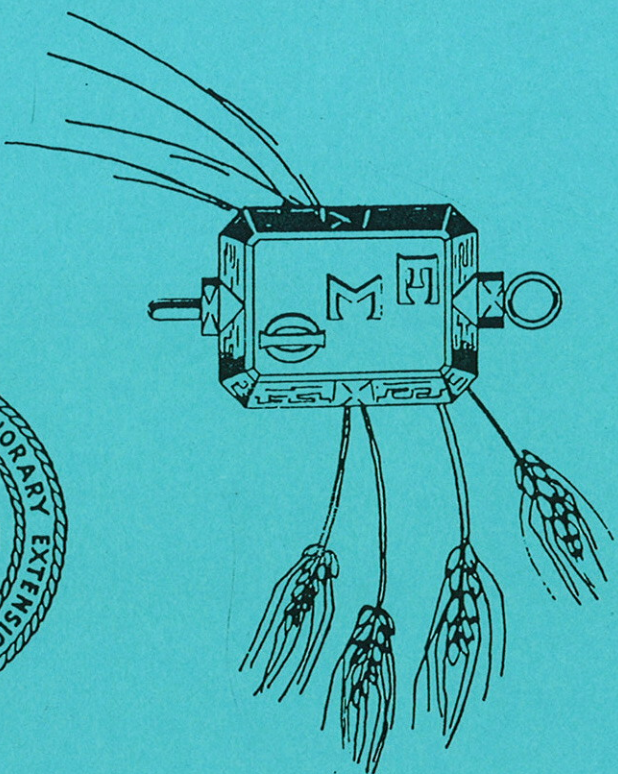
THE EMBLEM
