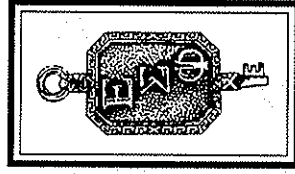

Purpose

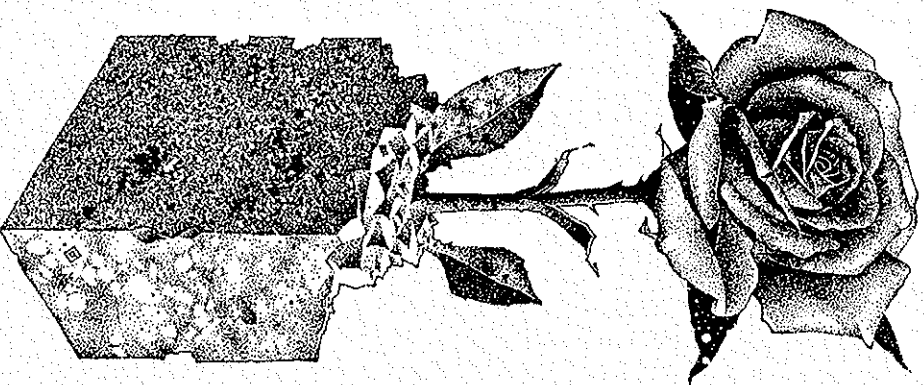
