The EFW grant team wrapped up 3 years of Empowering Financial Wellness programming across the state of Utah on June 30th. We made over 16,500 contacts since July 1, 2020. Participants in our programs who provided feedback reported an increase in savings dollars, an increase in their ability to handle an unexpected financial burden, and a steady increase in overall financial wellbeing. We received 10 awards from various professional organizations including back-to-back Best of State awards for finance education. We are so grateful to all faculty who engaged with us to serve participants in their respective communities. We are thrilled to have received another 3-year TANF grant and look forward to faculty input about opportunities to continue to collaborate.
