
Student Food Security

33% of USU students are food insecure

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) defines food insecurity as inadequate access to enough food for an active and healthy lifestyle.

Our mission is to increase access to nutritious food while educating Aggies about basic needs resources and sustainable food practices.

Canned Food

Canned and nonperishable food is donated by the Cache Community Food Pantry and the Utah Food Bank.



Breads & Premade Meals

Unsold breads, desserts, and premade meals are donated by USU Dining Services and Kneaders Bakery & Cafe.



Fresh Produce

Fresh produce in the summer and fall comes from the Student Organic Farm, Cache Community Gleaning, and local farmers and gardeners. During the winter produce is bought by donated funds.

Dollars were donated to assist paying for paid student positions, produce during the winter, and packaging supplies in 2021.



16,601

Pounds of previously unsold food was recovered and distributed by SNAC in 2021.

2,000

Pounds of food is picked up from the Cache Community Food Pantry EACH WEEK to stock the shelves.

Nearly all this food is gone by the end of the week.
