- Guests are invited to write a few paragraphs on a topic of their choice that touches on the dark-skies conversation.
- The length of the article is up to the author, but folks typically submit 1-2 pages (ideally around 500 to 800 words). Your audience is a diverse group of night sky advocates predominantly from the Western U.S. who have a basic knowledge of light pollution and dark skies.
- Please include any eye-catching images (e.g. photography, your entity's logo, maps, etc.) as you can. These are helpful & welcome! All photos will be credited appropriately.
- Draft articles can be submitted to the CPDSC Coordinator (lisa.stoner@usu.edu) as either a Google or Microsoft Word document, which will be reformatted and posted to the spotlight pages on the [Colorado Plateau](#) and [Basin and Range](#) Dark Sky Cooperatives websites, shared in our joint monthly newsletter, and social media outlets.
- Tips:
 - A catchy title is a plus!
 - Hyperlinks to websites or content referred to in the article are also helpful.
 - Consider providing information on how the audience can learn more or get in touch.
