The Juab 4-H Horse Program is off to a fantastic year, with two active clubs helping youth learn, grow, and gain valuable skills both in and out of the arena. With dedicated leaders and enthusiastic members, the program continues to be a place where kids build confidence, responsibility, and friendships through their love of horses.

Currently, Juab County is home to two horse clubs. The *Silver Spurs* club, based in Nephi, is led by the talented and committed **Jen Finlinson**, who brings years of knowledge and energy to her group. The *Buckles and Boots* club, out of Mona, is guided by the dynamic duo **Mavanie Ariza** and **Amy Reynolds**, who work tirelessly to create fun and meaningful experiences for their riders. Clubs meet weekly from **6–8 p.m. on Thursdays**, with activities ranging from horsemanship instruction and showmanship practice to educational lessons and games. During the winter months, meetings move to **Friday evenings from 6–8 p.m.** in the indoor arena, allowing the program to continue year-round.

An exciting event is right around the corner: the **Spooky Horse Show on October 25th**. Riders are invited to bring both their skills and creativity—horses and riders can dress up for a costume contest in addition to competing in traditional horse events. This is a fun, family-friendly way to celebrate the season and see the talents of local 4-H youth in action.
