


Reducing *E. coli* infection in Utah's Agritourism



E. coli in Utah

- Utah averages 113 cases of E. coli each year.
- Cases range in age from 7 months to 71 years old.
- Recently, there have been 50% more cases than expected in October of each year.
- Utah's fall agritourism events, such as petting zoos and corn mazes, add risk for infection.



Causes of infection

E. coli is a bacteria spread by consuming contaminated food or water, raw milk, contact with cattle, or contact with feces of infected people.

Petting zoos and areas with animals are at greater risk, especially if food is present. Good hand hygiene and signage is critical.



Prevent Infection

- Install hand washing stations with soap and water or hand sanitizer.
- Post signs that alert the public to wash their hands after any contact with animals and prior to any food consumption.
- Do not allow human food in barnyards.
