Fast Facts About Lacewings

- Both Green and Brown Lacewing larvae and adults are predatory.
- Lacewing larvae can eat up to 200 pest insects or their eggs in one week.
- Because Lacewing larvae are well know for feeding on aphids they are also called "aphid lions".
- Lacewings do not bite or sting.

Lacewing Lifecycle

Complete Metamorphosis


Egg: The adult lays a mass of eggs

Larva: The eggs hatch into larval stage and during this time the larva grows in size by molting

Pupa: Each larva spins a cocoon

Adult: The new adult emerges from the cocoon

Lacewing Lifecycle



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Females lay eggs in groups on slender stalks. UGA1475064

Larvae have sickle-shaped mandibles to pierce their prey
