



Salt Lake County Farm Bureau: 2018 Duane Breinholt Junior Livestock Mentoring Program

The Salt County Farm Bureau has established the Junior Livestock Mentoring Program to support youth residing in Salt Lake County an opportunity to raise and show a 4H or FFA livestock project. The Salt Lake County Farm Bureau wishes to promote and teach our youth the key principles of proper care, feeding, daily responsibility, training and good record keeping skills of livestock, as well as to learn, teach and promote agriculture in their communities. To achieve this, the Salt Lake County Farm Bureau will sponsor six youth who are members of either 4H or FFA, whose first year of raising a livestock project is 2018, and whose first show will be the Salt Lake County Fair held in August of 2018. The Salt Lake County Farm Bureau will select 6 projects (1 beef, 1 lamb, 1 hog, 1 goat and 2 additional projects) by a random drawing process. Those applicants who are selected will each be awarded \$150 during the County Fair.

To qualify for the Salt Lake County Farm Bureau Junior Livestock Mentoring Program you must:

- ✓ Be enrolled as either a 4H or FFA member and have a 4H or FFA leader who will help and support you in raising your animal and growing within your livestock project by learning key principles of proper care, feeding, daily responsibility, training, and good record keeping skills.
- ✓ You must have parental support and permission to participate in the Salt County Farm Bureau Junior Livestock Mentoring program.
- ✓ This must be your first livestock project and your first livestock show. If you have shown another livestock species before, you do not qualify for this program.
- ✓ You must show your project at the Salt Lake County Fair in 2018.
- ✓ You will be required to share and report about your experience during the Salt Lake County Fair. (A time will be arranged to meet with the Salt Lake County Farm Bureau board members and committee members.).
- ✓ APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED UP AND UNTIL THE EVENING OF THE LAST SALT LAKE COUNTY FAIR TAGGING DATE, MAY 24TH 2018.
