4-H Super Saturday: April 17th



It's one of our favorite county 4-H events and we want to be sure it is part of Tooele County 4-H in 2021. Like everything this past year, we'll do it but do it differently. This year it is Saturday, April 17th. It will start at 10 am and finish up around 12:30 pm. The format will be a progressive "round robin" style where everyone will get to do everything. Yes, this will be like nothing else we have ever done before!

Register for Super Saturday through 4h.zsuite.org. You must be currently registered for the 2020-21 4-H year. The cost will be \$3 per participant and registration is open to all 4-H, including cloverbuds. The registration deadline is April 12th. After you register, we will let you know which station will be your "start". Youth participation requires the assistance of an adult driver to get you from station to station.

Tooele County Jr. Livestock Show

Are you planning a 4-H livestock project for the Tooele County Jr. Livestock show this year? Here are a few dates to keep in mind:

- 4-H youth must be at least 8 years old as of Sept. 1, 2020 and in the 3rd grade for this 2020-21 school year.
- Beef projects must be tagged by April 26. Call 435-277-2407 or 2435-277-2405 for steer tagging.
- All goats, lambs and swine must be tagged by June 5. Tagging days and locations will be announced soon. Entry forms with fees are due to the livestock show by July 5. No late entries will be accepted. Livestock show book, entry forms and a new “show check-list” will be available online at tooele4h.org.
- The Tooele County Jr. Livestock Show will be Aug 4-7, 2021 at Deseret Peak. Questions, call the 4-H office.

(If you think you will show your animals at other livestock shows in the state, including the State Fair Show, you need a separate tag. See more information about tags and registration for other shows at www.utahjuniorlivestock.com.)



4-H Turkeys



Believe it or not its time to think about turkeys! Orders are due to the 4-H office by April 23 this year. Forms should be available soon on tooele4h.org. Youth must have turned 8 years old by September 1, 2020 and been in the 3rd grade this year to order poults. The tentative dates for the state turkey show are Nov. 11-13 . The poults usually arrive in late July or early August. (It helps to know so you can plan your summer around their arrival.)

4-H Horse Program

The county 4-H horse shows are scheduled for: June 11-12 & July 16-17 at the Bit & Spur Arena in Tooele and August 20-21 at the Grantsville Arena. The foal and 2-handed events are Friday evening and bitted events begin Saturday morning. (Dates and locations are subject to change.) The rotating events are Bareback Equitation and Scurry. Registration for the shows will be through 4h.zsuite.org.



The 2021 State Horse Show is at the Black Hawk Arena in Salina, September 22-25 (Sept 22 for English, Sept 23 for 2-handed and, new this year, in-hand foal, Sept 24-25 for the individual Western Show) The study curriculum for the test is online. Now is the time to approach businesses and individuals about sponsoring our 4-H horse program. Sponsorship letters are available from the horse council. Sponsors provide equipment, buckles, and more to keep the program going.

“New Events” Horse Clinic



4-H Youth in a horse project can learn all about the new events for this year’s horse shows at a clinic planned for April 10 at the Grantsville Arena. The clinician is the state judge at large. Each event is presented as a separate session: Scurry, Bareback, and In-Hand Foal. Start time depends on event. Sign up for 1 , 2 or all 3 of the different event sessions. This is a hands-on, riding clinic; bring your horse. Helmets are required. A parent or guardian must attend with the rider. You need to register in 4-H and for the clinic by April 1st to attend. Contact your horse club leader or Tamra at the 4-H office for a link to the registration (435-277-2405).

4-H Mock Legislature



Mock Legislature is a Utah 4-H tradition for 9th-12th grade youth from across Utah to try on the role of Legislator in a “hands on” experience. For 2021, it will be an “in person” event on April 27th from about 8 am-4:30 pm (includes the travel). We still have hope that it can be held at the Utah State Capital building, if not, a back-up site in Utah County is reserved.

Register through 4h.zsuite.org. Cost is \$20 and includes a t-shirt and Costa Vida lunch. Your 4-H enrollment must be current and active for 2021 to access the registration. Slots are limited and they can’t squeeze anyone in. The deadline is April 1, **BUT** this event always fills quickly; please, don't wait to sign up or you may be disappointed.

Progressive Round Robin Style

Here's the plan. All youth who will participate need to register through 4h.zsuite.org. You must be registered in 4-H for this year so you can register for Super Saturday.

Each group will start at one of the stations. Your group will be everyone who comes with you in your vehicle plus the people in a few other vehicles. Each group will rotate to all of the stations and have a chance to do everything. Our goal is to form groups of similar size.

After registration closes on Monday, April 12, we will let you know which station to start at and where it is located. At your first station, you'll receive a list of the other stations and the order you will visit them. Some stations are outdoors, some are indoors. Please dress accordingly and remember the weather.

Masks are required, yes, the mandate will be gone but USU Extension/4-H policy is they are required.

This is a new idea and we'll see how it goes. We think it will be amazing. Be sure to tell us what you think!

4-H Leadership Games: Leadership can be fun and just because its fun doesn't mean it's a waste of time. See if you don't agree!

4-H Blender Bike Salsa: Now you're talking, make the best salsa on the planet in the craziest way possible. You have to see it to believe it! Chips and salsa included.

4-H Horse: Get up close to a real horse. Learn about horses and riding and tack and stuff you didn't even know you wanted to know.

4-H Squishy Circuits: What is squishy and lights up? You'll have to come to this station and find out. Then take home a kit and amaze your friends.

4-H Sheep: Lots of 4-H kids raise sheep for the junior livestock show. Some even have their own flocks. See what a sheep project requires and how much fun it can be.

4-H Garden on a Paper Towel: Yup. It works and you'll make one for yourself to take home and plant. Now you just have to decide what you want to grow...

4-H "Get Your Groove On": There are lots of ways to exercise. Some make you sweat but this will make you smile.

4-H Masks: Hopefully they won't be needed all summer but they're still required at school. Turn a mask we provide into a work of art. You might even decide to keep it to show your grandchildren...
