TAKING YOUR 4-H EXPERIENCE TO THE NEXT LEVEL

4-H members strive to exemplify the 4-H motto “make the best better” by bettering themselves as well as their club, their community, and their world. Here are some ways you can develop your skills and take your 4-H experience to the next level.

Get Out of Your Comfort Zone

Participate in public speaking, volunteer to lead the 4-H pledge, or speak to someone new in your club even if it makes you uncomfortable. Sometimes to grow, you must step outside of your comfort zone. It may take a few tries before you feel confident doing it, but the more often you step outside of your comfort zone, the easier it will become.

Try Something New

Maybe you’ve never shown an animal before, or participated in a 4-H contest, or gone to a 4-H camp. Set a goal to try something new. If you are not sure what opportunities might be right for you, ask your 4-H leaders for guidance. Your confidence will grow as you discover new talents, skills, and friendships.

Help Others

Are you an experienced 4-H'er who knows all the ins and outs of your project area? Use your expertise to help other members. Help mentor them as they go through their 4-H project. Teach them how to write a resume and cover letter for their 4-H portfolio. As you help others your own knowledge, skills, and leadership abilities will grow.

Plan a Service Project

You have probably participated in a service project, but have you ever planned one? Look for a need in your community. Last holiday season, the Utah County 4-H Livestock Ambassadors made meal kits for kids in the Nebo School District experiencing food insecurity. Perhaps your local park needs cleaning up, or the residents at a nearby senior living facility could use some cheer. Think of ways you can fulfill this need and work with your 4-H leaders to implement a plan.



Run for a Leadership Position

If you are not currently in a leadership position, run for one. Become a club officer to help lead your fellow 4-H members. Apply to be a county or state project ambassador to educate others about 4-H and your project area. Join Junior Youth Council or Teen Council, where you will strengthen your leadership skills by mentoring and teaching others in 4-H. As a leader, you will have the opportunity to empower and inspire others.

Quick Tips

Combing Cattle Hair

From Utah County 4-H Livestock Ambassador Quaid Wride

Scotch & Fluffer combs are used when grooming the cattle's hair. Run the comb in a forward and upward direction, on the hip you will comb straight up and as you move forward you will angle it more towards the head. A fluffer comb is used much like that of the regular scotch comb, but its teeth are set further apart allowing the hair of the animal to pop or "fluff" as the comb is run through the hair.



2023 Scholarship Opportunity for Graduating Seniors

The 2023 Utah State Fair Junior Livestock Booster Club Scholarship is available to graduated senior (class of 2023) in each of the four market species exhibited at the Utah State Fair: beef, sheep, goats and swine. There will be a \$1,000 award given to the winning applicant in each species. Scholarships will be presented immediately prior the start of the Junior Livestock Auction at the Utah State State Fair.

Requirements:

1. The applicant must be a member in good standing of a 4-H Club or FFA Chapter.
2. The applicant must submit a current project record book with application.
3. The applicant must show at the 2023 Utah State Fair Jr. Livestock Show and participate in their species of choice Fitting & Showmanship contest at the Utah State Fair.
4. Finalists must be available for interview (virtual or in-person) with the Scholarship Committee.
5. Completed applications and record books will be submitted by August 21, 2023 to livestockscholarship@gmail.com Please submit application and record book in PDF. Additional pages are permitted.

Quick Tips
