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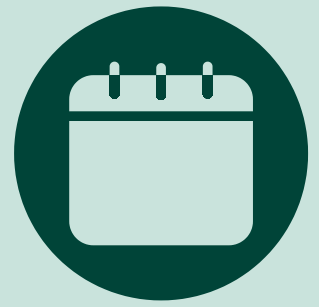

JOIN THE 4-H GENERATION

Enroll Now for the 2023-2024 4-H Year

Enrollment for the 2023-2024 4-H year begins September 1! All youth who wish to be a member and any adults serving as volunteers must enroll. For youth members there is a \$10 registration fee.



How to Enroll

- Step 1:** Login into [ZSuite](#) or select “SIGN UP” to create a family account.
- Step 2:** If you already have an account, click the blue “ENROLL MEMBER NOW” button next to the member’s name. If you are new to 4-H, select the green button that says “+ HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS” to add members to your household account.
- Step 3:** Update or enter the requested information for each member.
- Step 4:** Select the blue “+ ADD CLUB” button to select the desired club and project areas the member will be participating in. If you do not have a specific club to join, you can select the 4-H At Home | North UT CO Club or the 4-H at Home | South UT Co Club. If you select one of the 4-H at home clubs, we ask that at least one parent sign up as a volunteer.
- Step 5:** After the desired club(s) have been added, select “add to cart.”
- Step 6:** Select “Add Enrollment” to repeat steps 2-5 to add enrollments for other family members if needed. After enrollment is completed for each desired member, enter your credit card information to submit payment. You can also pay in person at our office or pay over the phone. If you wish to do so, please select the pay later option.

Volunteer required trainings

Volunteers are required to complete the annual Protection of Minors Training. If you are a new volunteer, you will also be required to complete the New Leaders Training and do a background screening. Trainings and screening must be complete for your enrollment to be approved. Once you're enrolled, you will receive an email with more information.

How to Complete Volunteer Trainings

- Step 1:** Log into your [ZSuite](#) account.
- Step 2:** Click the "switch profile" button in the upper right corner. You may need to click the household tab to expand the menu.
- Step 3:** Select your profile. As a volunteer, you will have an account separate of your household account.
- Step 4:** Select "Clover Academy" from the menu on the left.
- Step 5:** Click "launch Clover Academy" to either begin the for the first time or pick up where you left off.
- Step 6:** Scroll down to select the desired course. Courses are available in English or Spanish.
- Step 7:** Being viewing the course. Courses must be viewed in order, but do not have to be viewed all in one sitting.
- Step 8:** Be to click the "Mark Complete" button in the bottom right after you have viewed the course. The course will not be marked complete until this button has been selected.
- Step 9:** After the final course in complete, click the "Mark Complete" button again.

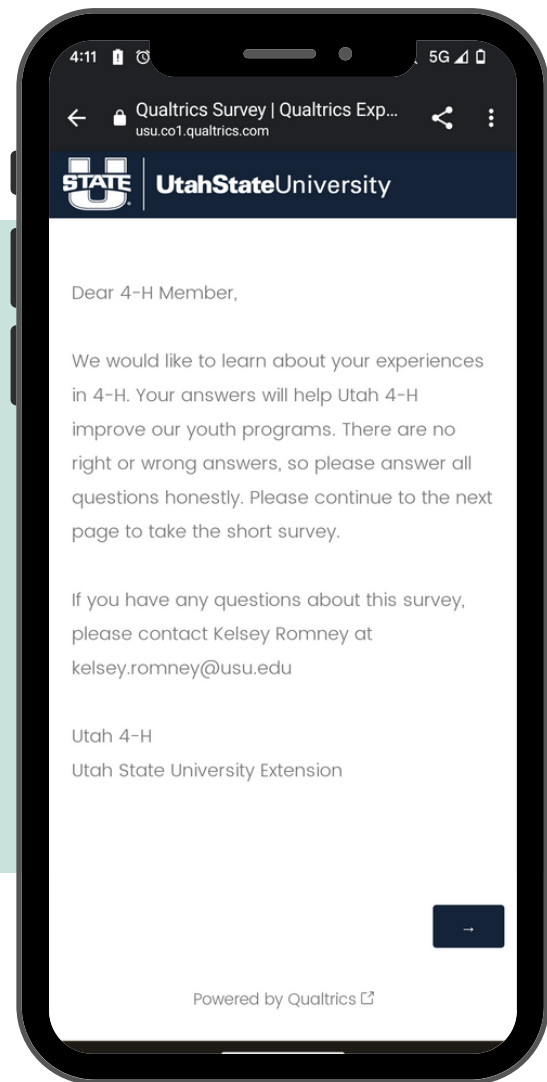

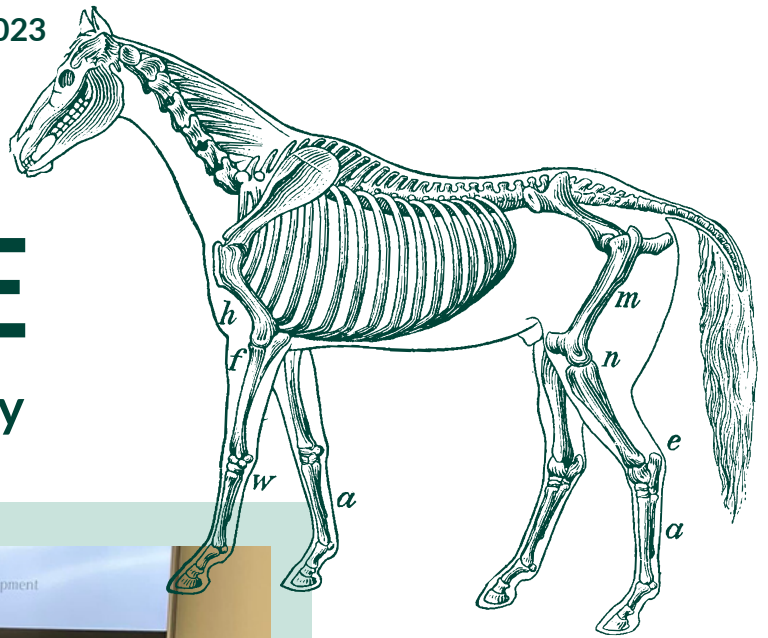

We are thrilled to have a regular dog club meetings with our volunteer leader, Melissa! Club members will learn all about the proper care and handling of dogs from their nose to toes. They also learn how to compete in 4-H showmanship, American Kennel Club obedience and rally.

To compete, youth must be ages 8 to 18 but we allow youth 5 and up to participate. All ages and breeds or mixed breed dogs are allowed to be part of the project.
