



Livestock Tagging Process

Step 1: Register for 4-H at <u>4h.zsuite.org</u>. All youth must have an "active" status before animals may be tagged.

Step 2: Attend a tagging event. All tags are \$2 each. Payment is required at time of tagging (exact cash or check made out to Utah County 4-H).

^{*}Please note: Tagging an animal does not register youth for show participation.


^{*}Please note: Youth must be at least 8 years old and in 3rd grade by the tagging deadline for the shows in order to participate.

INTERMOUNTAIN LIVESTOCK AND **MEATS JUDGES TRAINING**

A one-of-a-kind camp with a goal of preparing youth to compete in livestock judging contests as well as enter the ring as official judges at fairs and jackpots. There are two tracks, a livestock judging track and a meats judging track. There will be special breakout sessions for where youth will work on oral reasons. coaches will discuss recruitment and and team practice strategies, and other adults will talk about judging in the showring.

On Saturday, the 2024 Livestock State Contests will be held, including: Livestock Bowl, Livestock Judging, Meats Judging, and Livestock Skill-a-thon. Youth that want to represent Utah at the National Western Roundup in January, make sure you attend!

UTAH COUNTY 4-H HORSE OF THE YEAR NOMINATIONS







The Utah County 4-H, Horse of the Year is an award to be given annually to the equine athlete who demonstrates the value of the 4-H Horse Program in developing horsemanship skills in youth. This award is open to nominations for any 4-H project horse. An exceptional candidate for this honor would be one that not only scores well under their rider's rein, but also demonstrates the powerful bond needed to execute true teamwork in the arena. 4-H Horses are the foundation for many youths' show careers and life-long friends that help to develop lessons that can be applied beyond the saddle. This award is designed to honor those equine athletics that build confidence, sportsmanship and horsemanship. Any Utah County 4-H parent, club leader or youth may nominate a 4-H project horse, pony or mule.

Learn about Dogs, from Their Nose to Their Toes

At weekly meetings, club members will learn all about the proper care and handling of dogs from their nose to toes. They also learn how to compete in 4-H showmanship, American Kennel Club obedience and rally.
