Jeff Schick of the NRCS gave a background how the CRMP got started, where funding was obtained with help from former Senator Bennett. Jeff explained that diverse land management entities require active coordination. This rural, natural resourced-based community covering 1.5 million acres needs a plan to focus efforts.
