- For a Prepared Speech, contestants can prepare a speech on any topic relative to today's youth. Topic is not limited to 4-H project work, but contestants should relate their experiences as a 4-H'er to their topic of choice.
- For an Impromptu Speech, contestants will select a topic for their speech by randomly drawing three questions/statements from a pool of topics. They will select one question/statement and return the other two. Contestants will be allowed 3 minutes to organize their thoughts before beginning their presentation.
- Giving a 4-H project demonstration can be fun! In a demonstration, you show and tell about a fact, idea, or process. You've probably given demonstrations in the past but didn't know it. When you have learned how to do something in your 4-H project and then showed another club member, you gave a demonstration.



Thank you to Weber County Emergency Management for teaching. Thank you to Chery from the Extension office for being one of our victims and helping us learn.









Jr. Livestock Education Tests

- This online contest runs October through July
- Every month there is a test for each species: beef, sheep, swine, & goats
- All of the questions for the test come from Ohio State University's resource handbooks, which are available for purchase from the 4-H office for around \$30 each, depending on the species
- Each month's test will focus on a different chapter, or two, of the handbooks (see the schedule on the next page)
- The test questions are a combination of true/false, multiple choice, and fill-in-the-blank
- Tests are open book with a time limit of 30 minutes
- Tests will close the last day of each month
- At the end of the contest, awards are given for each species in each age division

How to take the tests:


- Youth must be in 3rd-12th grade
- Youth must be enrolled in 4-H with fees paid
- Log in to <u>ZSuite</u>
- · Click on "Events"
- Search for "Livestock Education Tests" to find the current month's test
- Select test
- Youth can take the tests for all 4 species
- Youth DO NOT have to be raising that species to take a test

- Desire to facilitate and motivate youth while nurturing self-esteem, decisionmaking skills, responsibility, and leadership
- Successfully pass the volunteer training process
- Ability to organize information and materials and delegate responsibility
- Ability to work and communicate effectively both verbally and written
- Desire to motivate parents and other volunteers
- Interest in working in partnership with youth, other volunteers and professional staff in an educational setting
- Willingness to adopt the philosophy, policies, and procedures of your 4-H organization

4-H Leader Responsibilities

- Develop a caring relationship with members
- Create a safe environment for 4-H members
- Provide opportunities for youth to build skills
- Create opportunities for youth to value and practice service to others
- Allow youth to make decisions and lead
- Create an inclusive environments
- Keep up-to-date and trained
