July 8th - July 10th @ USU Logan Campus -

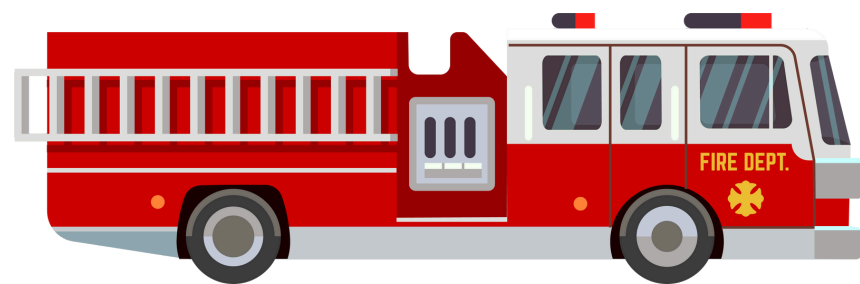

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Recycle Sewing Fun is a contest encouraging participants to showcase their creativity by repurposing old materials into new and innovative sewing projects  

Rules -

Submission:

Participants must bring their finished recycled article to the contest.

Materials:

Show your creativity by using recycled materials such as old shirts, old jeans, old socks, old blankets, etc.

Presentation:

Participants will be required to explain their project, detailing what they did and what they learned during the creative process.

- For a Prepared Speech, contestants can prepare a speech on any topic relative to today's youth. Topic is not limited to 4-H project work, but contestants should relate their experiences as a 4-H'er to their topic of choice.
- For an Impromptu Speech, contestants will select a topic for their speech by randomly drawing three questions/statements from a pool of topics. They will select one question/statement and return the other two. Contestants will be allowed 3 minutes to organize their thoughts before beginning their presentation.
- Giving a 4-H project demonstration can be fun! In a demonstration, you show and tell about a fact, idea, or process. You've probably given demonstrations in the past but didn't know it. When you have learned how to do something in your 4-H project and then showed another club member, you gave a demonstration.

Jr. Livestock Education Tests

- This online contest runs October through July
- Every month there is a test for each species: beef, sheep, swine, & goats
- All of the questions for the test come from Ohio State University's resource handbooks, which are available for purchase from the 4-H office for around \$30 each, depending on the species
- Each month's test will focus on a different chapter, or two, of the handbooks (see the schedule on the next page)
- The test questions are a combination of true/false, multiple choice, and fill-in-the-blank
- Tests are open book with a time limit of 30 minutes
- Tests will close the last day of each month
- At the end of the contest, awards are given for each species in each age division

How to take the tests:

- Youth must be in 3rd-12th grade
- Youth must be enrolled in 4-H with fees paid
- Log in to [ZSuite](#)
- Click on "Events"
- Search for "Livestock Education Tests" to find the current month's test
- Select test
- Youth can take the tests for all 4 species
- Youth DO NOT have to be raising that species to take a test
